#### Does the Extended Project Qualification enhance students' GCE A-level performance?

Ben Jones

Those results indicate that, after controlling for other available explanatory variables – of which mean GCSE prior attainment score is the most critical – taking the EPQ enhances the odds of achieving a higher grade A-level (A\*-B) by 29 per cent.

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
