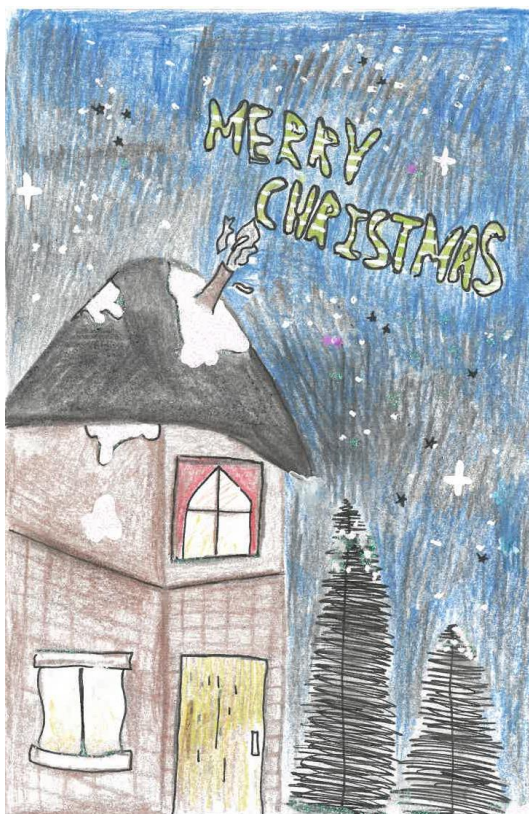
Christmas Card Competition

There was great work from so many students!

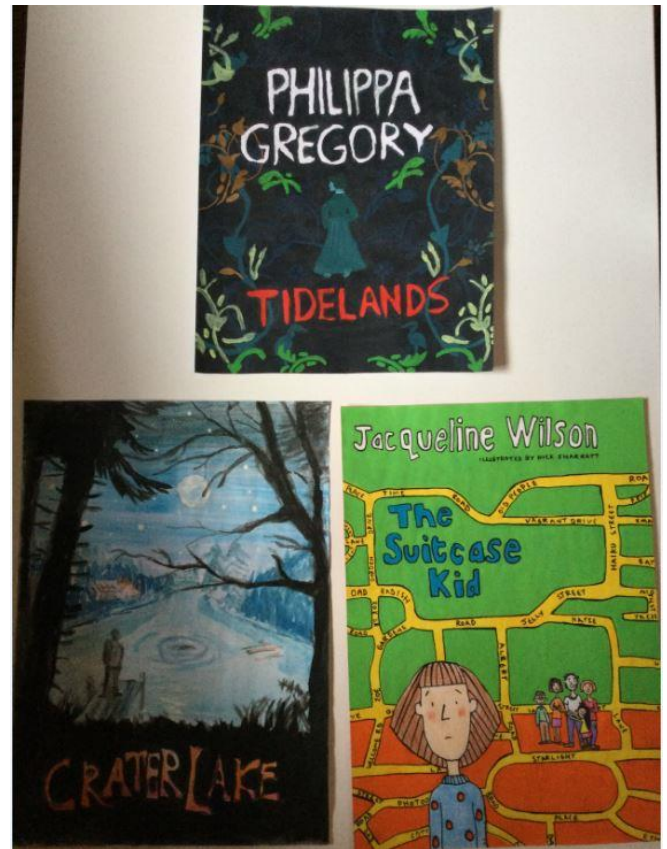

House Captains: Lirush, Amelia, George, Olivia, Anna, William and Amelie

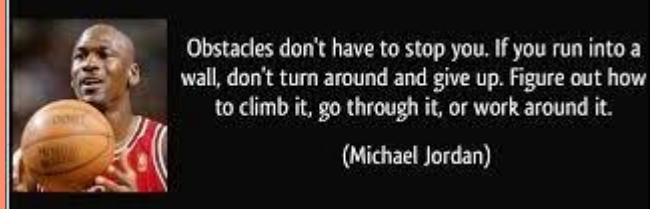
